

How Great Is Your Faith?

Matthew 15:22-28

- I. Great Faith overcomes the Lord's seemingly reluctant to move. (v. 23)
 - a. Difficult circumstances test our faith.
 - b. God allows our faith to be tested.
 - c. Faith must grow and be developed. (Rom. 11:6)
- II. Great Faith is measured by our endurance and perseverance in difficult situations
 - a. Our faith is measured by how we handle difficult circumstances.
 - b. God will allow impossible circumstance to come in our life to test our faith.
- III. Great Faith knows that delay doesn't mean a denial. (v.26)
 - a. God wants to see our faith.
- IV. Great Faith passes up the opportunity to be discouraged.
- V. Great Faith ignores negativity.

Every believer has some faith, but few have "Great Faith." (Rom. 12:3)

What are we doing with the measure of faith that we have?

Our faith needs to be exercised. The greater our faith is, the easier it is to live this Christian life. We need faith to quench the fiery darts of the enemy (Eph. 6:16). We must believe the Word of God in order to stand against the onslaught of the devil (Eph. 6:17).

Our faith is either getting stronger, or it's getting weaker. God's Word is life to us, and we must live our life according to His Word. Men ought to always to pray and not faint. We have the ability to pray and then rest in the Lord. If you have the ability to give it to God and then rest, then you have Great Faith.
