The Baptism of the Holy Spirit

IV. Misconceptions to Guard Against

A. The baptism of the Spirit is different from being born of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is present in the life of all born again believers.

B. The experience of the baptism of the Holy Spirit is for only those who are already saved.

C. The baptism of the Holy Spirit does not make us mature believers. It is not the same as having the fruit of the Spirit. (Galatians 5:22)

D. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is not the same as being sanctified or cleansed by the Spirit.

E. The power or anointing of the Holy Spirit must be renewed through worship, prayer, and obedience to the Word.

Principles of Christian Growth

Anything that does not grow will die. This is true of all forms of life and especially human beings. All infants must grow or die the same can be said concerning all spiritual born believers. The Word, prayer, and worship are the basic ingredients for the Christian life. Without these, the Christian cannot mature. The believer should grow in his/her faith and obedience to the Lord.

I. Cultivate a Desire for the Word (I Peter 2:2)

A. As we read the Word, it reveals God's nature, redemptive

acts, and direction for our lives. (Isaiah 40:12; John 3:16; Matthew 7:13-14)

B. As we meditate on the Word, we grow spiritually and build our faith (Psalm 1:1-2; Romans 10:17)

C. As we study the Word, we are equipped for service. (2 Timothy 2:15)

D. As we practice the Word, we mature spiritually. (Matthew 7:24-29)

E. As our hearts are in terms of receiving the Word, so are we, with respect to growth and maturity. (Mark 4:14-20) The quality of the soil determines growth.

II. Cultivate a Prayer Life (Luke 18:1)

Learning to Walk in God's Will

The most important goal every believer should have is to do the will of God. Jesus was our perfect example in this respect. He always did the will of the Father. Our Lord has a wonderful plan for each of our lives. He challenges us to reach our fullest potential. That can only be approached as we know the will of the Father and do it. We can only be used by God as we allow the Holy Spirit to lead us on a daily basis. Notwithstanding, the devil does everything he can to entice us away from the will of God. If we do not know how to deal with temptation, we will constantly miss the will of God.

I. As our Lord was tempted while here on earth so can we expect to be tempted.

A. The purpose of temptation is to test our commitment to doing God's will rather than our own. (James 1:2-4)

B. Temptation comes from three sources: the weakness of the flesh the pressure of the world system, and Satan. (James 1:13-15; 1 Peter 5:8; 1 John 2:14-15)

II. We must be led by the Spirit in order to overcome temptation (I Corinthians 10:12-13)

A. The Spirit leads us as we receive instruction through preaching and teaching. (Romans 10:14-17)

B. We can be led by the Spirit as we meditate on the Word. (Psalm 1: 1-2; 119:105)

C. We can be led by the Sprit as we seek the Lord in prayer and Fasting. (Acts 13:2-3)

Stewardship is a vital part of worship and ministry. Ancient Israel was admonished never to come before the Lord empty handed (Deuteronomy 16:16,17).
